Dear Mr. Slavitt:

The Committee on the Judiciary is continuing to conduct its investigation into how and to what extent the Executive Branch has coerced and colluded with companies and other intermediaries to censor speech. To develop effective legislation, such as the possible enactment of new statutory limits on the Executive Branch's ability to work with social media platforms and other companies to restrict the circulation of content and deplatform users, the Committee must first understand the nature of this collusion and coercion. As one of the primary liaisons between the Executive Office of the President (EOP) and social media companies, you are uniquely positioned to advance the Committee's oversight. On June 29, 2023, and again on September 29, 2023, the Committee requested that you voluntarily appear for a transcribed interview for this purpose. After you failed to comply with our voluntary requests, the Committee issued a subpoena to compel your testimony at a deposition. Despite being provided numerous accommodations from the Committee, you failed to appear for your deposition scheduled for January 31, 2024. Since your testimony is critical to the Committee's oversight efforts, we now respectfully request your testimony at a hearing before the Select Subcommittee on the Weaponization of the Federal Government.

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As detailed in previous correspondence to you and your counsel, the Committee has obtained documents that demonstrate the central role you played in communicating the Biden White House's censorship efforts to social media companies, including the White House's demands to censor true information, memes, satire, and other constitutionally protected forms of expression. As one of the Biden White House's primary representatives responsible for interfacing with large social media companies, you likely have knowledge about the White House officials responsible for leading the Biden censorship regime as well as information regarding the intent behind various messages you and others sent to social media companies. For example, internal Facebook documents obtained by the Committee illustrate your specific role in threatening high-ranking Facebook executives to censor Americans' speech, including critics of the Biden Administration. These internal notes reveal that you were "outraged" that Facebook did not remove a meme and that you disregarded a warning from Facebook's President for Global Affairs Nick Clegg that censorship of memes and jokes would "represent a significant incursion into traditional boundaries of free expression in the US."

Accordingly, we write to respectfully request your testimony at a hearing before the Select Subcommittee on the Weaponization of the Federal Government of the Committee on the Judiciary titled, "Hearing on the Weaponization of the Federal Government," on May 1, 2024, at 10:00 a.m. in room 2141 of the Rayburn House Office Building. The enclosed Witness Instruction Sheet provides information for witnesses appearing before the Committee. Please note the procedures for submitting written testimony at least two business days prior to the hearing. Please confirm your appearance before the Committee as soon as possible, but no later than 5:00 p.m. on April 16, 2024. If you have any questions, please contact Committee staff at (202) 225-6906. - (5)(A) Each committee shall, to the greatest extent practicable, require witnesses who appear before it to submit in advance written statements of proposed testimony and to limit their initial presentations to the committee to brief summaries thereof.
- (B) In the case of a witness appearing in a non-governmental capacity, a written statement of proposed testimony shall include—(i) a curriculum vitae; (ii) a disclosure of any Federal grants or contracts, or contracts, or payments originating with a foreign government, received during the past 36 months by the witness or by an entity represented by the witness and related to the subject matter of the hearing; and (iii) a disclosure of whether the witness is a fiduciary (including, but not limited to, a director, officer, advisor, or resident agent) of any organization or entity that has an interest in the subject matter of the hearing.
