The Committee on House Administration, the Committee on the Judiciary, and the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform are charged with ensuring the integrity of American elections.¹ To that end, the Committees are examining allegations that ActBlue, a leading political fundraising organization, allowed bad actors, including foreign actors, to exploit the company's online platform to make fraudulent political donations.² ActBlue has employed Sift's "AI-powered fraud prevention" software since 2020.³ Documents produced to the Committees indicate that you possess information vital to our oversight.⁴ Accordingly, we respectfully request your cooperation and ask that you make yourself available for a transcribed interview with the Committees.

Communications produced to the Committees indicate that in your role as Sift's Director of Customer Success, you worked closely with ActBlue's fraud-prevention team.⁵ The Committees are concerned that ActBlue has maintained poor anti-fraud practices that may have

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allowed bad actors to make fraudulent political donations, including from foreign sources.⁶ Fraudulent political donations corrupt American elections and could amount to interstate criminal conduct.⁷ Furthermore, as the Committees have documented, many questions remain unanswered about ActBlue's fraud-prevention policy changes in 2024 and Sift's subsequent role in facilitating the fundraising organization's "more lenient approach" to fraud prevention.⁸

Your knowledge of Sift's software, operations, and experience with ActBlue's fraudprevention efforts makes your testimony critical to the Committees' oversight. Pursuant to the Rules of the House of Representatives, the Committees have jurisdiction to conduct oversight of matters concerning elections, civil liberties, criminal law, and U.S. national security to inform potential legislative reforms.⁹ To schedule your transcribed interview, please contact Judiciary Committee staff at (202) 225-6909 as soon as possible, but no later than 5:00 p.m. ET on May 13, 2025.

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
