Dear Ms. Lee:

In January 2025, deadly wildfires devastated and wreaked havoc in the state of California.<sup>1</sup> In response to the wildfires, an organization called FireAid held a benefit concert raising \$100 million, which the organization promised to send directly to people affected by the wildfires.<sup>2</sup> According to available information, the Community Organized Relief Efforts (CORE) received grant money from FireAid.<sup>3</sup> As part of our oversight responsibilities, we request your voluntary cooperation with our inquiry.

According to an internal report commissioned by FireAid, CORE received \$250,000 in grants to support victims of the California wildfires.<sup>4</sup> CORE's stated mission is to "empower communities in and beyond crisis" and its vision is to build a "more equitable world in which underserved communities are prepared and can effectively respond to crisis from within."<sup>5</sup> A grant report dated February 2025 included a list of CORE's "priority groups" that it sought to help using money received from FireAid.<sup>6</sup> Among those priority groups were "Undocumented

Migrants,” who CORE asserted are “at high risk of housing instability, economic hardship, exploitation, and homelessness.”<sup>7</sup>

On January 8, 2025, then-President Biden approved a disaster declaration for the California fires, making federal funds available to victims and authorizing federal agencies to assist in the recovery efforts.<sup>8</sup> The nation has an important interest in assisting victims of federally declared disaster and in discouraging potential fraud or misuse of charitable funds solicited to help these victims. It is critical in this case that money raised for fire recovery efforts go directly to victims of the California fires. Therefore, as part of the Committee’s oversight, we respectfully ask that you provide the following documents and information:

1. A detailed breakdown of all money received from FireAid, directly and indirectly, including the amount, date, recipient, and purpose of each expenditure; and
2. All documents and communications referring or relating to FireAid for the period January 1, 2025, to the present.

Please produce all documents and information as soon as possible but no later than 5:00 p.m. on January 20, 2026.

The Supreme Court has recognized that Congress has a “broad and indispensable” power to conduct oversight, which “encompasses inquiries into the administration of existing laws, studies of proposed laws, and surveys in our social, economic or political system for the purpose of enabling Congress to remedy them.”<sup>9</sup> Pursuant to the Rules of the House of Representatives the Judiciary Committee is authorized to conduct oversight of matters concerning criminal law and fraud in order to inform potential legislative reform.<sup>10</sup>
